the night of October 31st, which is now celebrated by children, who **dress in costumes** and go from house to house **asking for sweets**, especially in the US and Canada. In the past, people believed the <u>souls of dead people appeared</u> on Halloween.

jack-o'-lantern noun [countable]



a pumpkin that has a face cut into it and a candle put inside to shine through the holes

My daughter wore a <u>witch costume</u> in the **Halloween parade**.





1 - go **trick or treat**ing

if children go trick or treating, they dress in costumes and go from house to house on Halloween saying 'trick or treat' in order to get sweets

2 - the words that children say when they go trick or treating, to say that they will **play a trick on** someone if they are not given a **treat** (=sweet)

<u>kettle:</u> American English a large pot, used for making soup (üst)

- 1 a haunted building /house is believed to be visited regularly by the soul of a dead person
- 2 haunted expression/looka very worried or frightened expression



turkey noun/t3:ki, \$t3:rki/

- 1 [countable] a bird that looks like a large chicken and is often eaten at Christmas and at Thanksgiving
- 2 [uncountable] the meat from a turkey eaten as food (roast turkey)
- 3 [countable] American English informal an unsuccessful film or play
- 4 <u>talk turkey</u> *informal, especially American English* to talk seriously about details, especially in business
